EDITORIAL

For 8 weeks running, the ladies of the Social Sub-Committee of the Jindalee Sea Scouts and their many helpers have given their Saturdays and Sundays to man the drink and sweet halls at the centre of the Village. They have stacked cases of soft drinks, carried boxes of sweets and defied rain and cold weather in an unforgettable drive to raise money for the Jindalee Sea Scouts.

Thanks to their initiative and efforts we can now seriously start planning for our land ship "Derwent". At present we have no facilities in Jindalee to cater for our Cubs and Scouts during bad weather.

The Committee at its last meeting ear marked \$500 as an initial advance towards the proposed Land Ship. A further intensive drive to obtain additional funds has been launched and we feel quite confident the result thereof, coupled with the promises already received regarding assistance in the purchase of materials, will enable us to commence this project before the end of this year.

But much more is still required. We have at present 23 Cubs and 20 Sea Scouts and applications for enrolment are being received regularly. After 2 years of operations, we have now reached the stage where the pack is closed for men members and any Parents, who wish their boy to join in the future should forward his name and age to the General Scout Master, Mr. Dick Speechley (Phone 39 1425). This is necessary to programme future training.
