JAMBOREE HEIGHTS

(established August 1969 – 2nd Centenary Suburb)

Originally named by Queensland Place Names Board on 1 July 1969.

Name and boundaries confirmed by Minister for Survey and Valuation, Urban and Regional Affairs on 11 August 1975.

Suburb

Name was derived from the area being the site of the 8th Pan Pacific -Australian Scout Jamboree held in December 1967-January 1968.

Many <u>street names</u> are derived from Scouting terminology in deference to the Scout Jamboree as well as names with a nautical background.

Beanland Street	(Formerly Estate Road) – renamed Beanland Street in honour of the retired Principal of the Jamboree Heights State School – Basil Beanland – who retired in December 1979 (BCC Archives)
Bollard Street	Scouting terminology – following Scout Jamboree 1967-68
Bowline Street	Scouting terminology – knot in rope
Brownie Street	Scouting terminology – following Scout Jamboree 1967-68
Burgee Street	Nautical term – a swallow-tailed flag, a distinguishing pennant, used by cutters, yachts and merchant vessels

Compass Close	Scouting terminology - instrument for ascertaining a bearing

Dandenong Road	Aboriginal word for "high" (S.E. Endacott) – Road specifically named to commemorate the venue in Dandenong (Victoria) of the 7 th Australian Scouts Jamboree

Emblem Street	Scouting terminology – following Scout Jamboree 1967-68
Estate Road	Taken from 'Centenary Estate' the overall name of the development

Fathom Close	Nautical word – a unit of depth in the imperial system equal to 6 feet or 1.8288m – used in nautical measurements
Flag Street	Scouting terminology – a piece of bunting attached to staff or halyard

Galleon Street	Nautical word – a kind of large Spanish sailing vessel of former times
Guide Street	Scouting terminology – following Scout Jamboree 1967-68

Hallyard Street	Mostly spelt 'Halyard" – a rope for raising or lowering a sail or flag
Harans Street	Creature from Swedish mythology
Helm Close	Nautical word – the tiller or wheel by which the rudder of a ship is controlled, entire steering apparatus

Ketch Street	Nautical term – a sailing vessel with a large main-mast and a smaller mast in front

Laptev Close	Named after the Laptev Sea – a section of the Arctic Ocean located

Loffs' Road	LOFF pioneer family owned land in 1800's

Marconi Close	Guglielmo MARCONI (1874-1937) – Italian electrical engineer
	known as the father of radio

	Named after the "Guglielmo Marconi" ship built in 1963 for Lloyd
	Triestino's Genoa-Sydney service.
Masthead Street	Nautical word – top of the mast of a ship

Mercator Street	Nautical word – from Mercator's projection – map projection with parallels and meridians forming a rectangular grid, used particularly for navigation although the scale varies and shapes of large areas are distorted
Mistral Street	A cold, dry, northerly wind common in southern France and neighbouring areas

Pintle Close	Nautical word – pin or bolt
Port Street	Nautical word – the left-hand side of a ship facing forward
Poisedon Crescent	Named after the God of the Sea in Greek mythology

Reef Close	from Scouting terminology – a "reef knot" which is a double knot that does not slip (BCC Archives)

Sabot Street	Nautical word – a blunt nosed trainee sailing dinghy (BCC Archives)
Schooner Street	Nautical word – a sailing ship with two or more masts and Fore-and-aft rig
Sirocco Street	A hot, dust-laden, dry southerly wind originating in the North African desert

Spinnaker Street –	Nautical word – large triangular sail with a light boom, carried by yachts on the side opposite the mainsail when running before the wind, or with the wind behind the beam
Sumners Road	Richard SUMNER (b. 1859) was a Member of the Legislative Council 1907-1922; farmer and fruit canner at Zillmere; owned property in what is now known as Riverhills area

Transom Close	Nautical word - beam at the rear of a boat
